In Memoriam

We are deeply saddened to report that Dr. James Bawden passed away peacefully on June 23, 2011.

Jim was born April 23, 1930 in St Louis and completed his DDS, MS, PhD and pediatric dentistry at the University of Iowa. After serving as a dental officer in the United States Navy Dental Corps from 1954-1956, Jim

entered private practice in Glenwood Springs Colorado. In 1958 Jim returned to the University of Iowa to complete a postdoctoral fellowship and then joined the faculty at the University of North Carolina, School of Dentistry in 1961 as an Assistant Professor in the Department of Pediatric

Jessica has had a busy year in all of these arenas and is most deserving of this wonderful recognition. She maintains an active practice, is working in several different research areas on NIH funded projects and is a leader in pediatric dentistry severing on local and national councils and committees.

Bill Vann Recognized by Dental Alumni



Congratulations to **Bill Vann (1976)** for being named the recipient of the *John C. Brauer Award* for a lifetime of service to the dental profession and the UNC School of Dentistry. It is quite fitting that Bill receive this award for his many outstanding contributions to the School, the profession and the people of North Carolina.

This award was bestowed on Bill by the UNC Dental Alumni Association at the May 2011 North Carolina Dental Society Annual Session at Myrtle Beach. Bill has earned this award many times over though his teaching, research and service to the School of Dentistry and Pediatric Dentistry.

Dentistry. He was promoted to Professor in 1965 and became the second Dean of the School of Dentistry serving from 1966 to 1974.

Jim became an Alumni Distinguished Professor in the Department of Pediatric Dentistry in 1977 and served in a variety of leadership roles during the remainder of his professional career.

He was a passionate man who immersed himself into teaching, patient care and research. Jim published over 127 peer reviewed manuscripts with some of his most exciting work coming at the end of his career when he was working on calcium-sensing mechanisms during enamel formation. He was a pioneer in the investigation of fluorides in preventive dentistry. Jim's first research funding from the National Institutes of Health was awarded in

1961 and his last grant was funded in 1996.

Students revered Jim because he was not only a fervent teacher, but he was a great student advocate and mentor. He remained engaged in teaching and patient care throughout his career.

One of Jim's most notable qualities was his skill as a leader and his ability to develop consensus. As a result of these qualities he was instrumental in leading initiatives on such topics

as fluoride supplementation dosage schedules and helping develop programs that addressed access to care for children less than three years of age that changed oral health care for children across the nation. Jim's legacy in dentistry and his influence on the UNC School of Dentistry will remain with us and he will be missed very much.

Dr. Sheller is dual trained in orthodontics and pediatric dentistry and is the Chief of Dental Education and Resident Training. Understanding the unique characteristics of children with AD/HD or autism can minimize difficulties during dental treatment and enhance communication and outcomes.

Highlights of this course include core features, diagnosis/misdiagnosis, treatment modalities for AD/HD and autism, and implications for cooperation and behavior guidance during dental treatment. Those attending this course will be able to recognize the signs and symptoms of these disorders, understand how the disorders are diagnosed, gain insight in the effect the conditions have on daily life, become familiar with multi-modal treatment of the disorders including medications and complimentary/

Special!! CE Credit for Adjunct Faculty

Good news! Many of our Adjunct Faculty members volunteer to come and teach a day or two per year in our pediatric dentistry predoctoral clinic here at the UNC School of Dentistry. This is of great help to us in providing faculty coverage in our clinics and also is much appreciated by the dental students to have exposure to private practicing pediatric dentists.

The NC State Board of Dental Examiners (NCSBDE) now permit granting one hour of CE credit for volunteering at an approved site up to maximum of 2 CE credit hours per calendar year. We have been approved as a volunteer site and will now be able to provide one hour of CE credit for each 5 hours of volunteered teaching time.

Our volunteer adjunct faculty members usually attend both a morning (3 hours) and afternoon (3 hours) clinics when they are here. Therefore, one hour of CE credit will be forwarded to each volunteer faculty member for each day they teach up to the maximum of 2 CE credit hours in a calendar year. The CE credit certificate will be issued by the School of Dentistry's Office of Continuing Education at the end of the calendar year. This is retroactive to January 1, 2011.
